"Taem mi smol pikinini mi no save ridim baebol an mi no save wat nao baebol tok aboatem long laef. Bat taem mi atendem skul litrasi mi save ridim an minim wat nao baebol tok abaotem long laef blong mi. Baebol hemi som mi gudfala laef."

"When I was a small child, I didn't read the Bible and didn't know what the Bible said about life. But after attending literacy classes, I could read and understand what the Bible says about my life. The Bible teaches me the right way to live."

The Pijin Bible was launched in 2008, and already a third printing is underway. Praise God that this Bible is continuing to have an impact.


